The EU2 is a fast recovery diode of 400 V / 1.0 A. The maximum $t_{\rm rr}$ of 400 ns is realized by optimizing a life-time control.

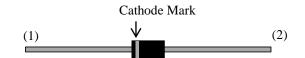

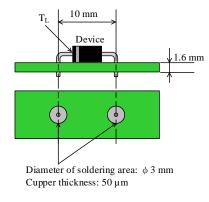


Figure 1. Lead Temperature Measurement Conditions

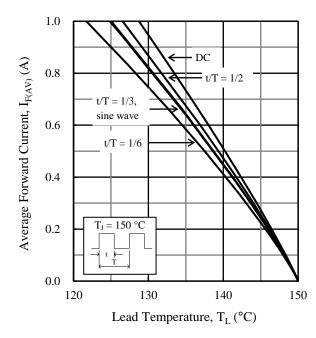


Figure 2. Typical Characteristics: $I_{F(AV)}$ vs. $T_L^{(2)}$ ($V_R = 0$ V)

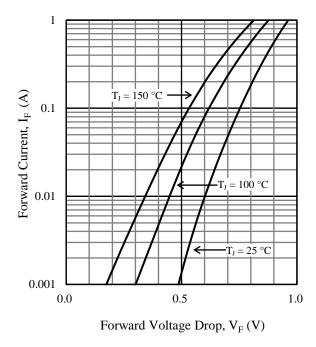


Figure 4. Typical Characteristics: I_F vs. V_F

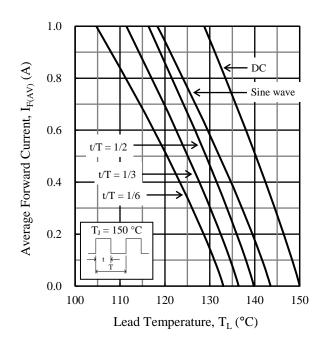


Figure 3. Typical Characteristics: $I_{F(AV)}$ vs. $T_L^{(2)}$ ($V_R = 400$ V)

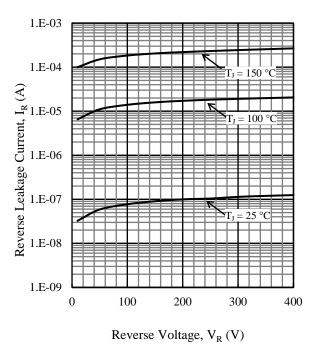
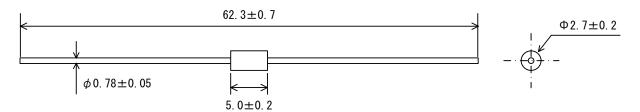


Figure 5. Typical Characteristics: I_R vs. V_R

- When soldering the products, it is required to minimize the working time within the following limits: Flow: 260 ± 5 °C / 10 ± 1 s, 2 times Soldering Iron: 380 ± 10 °C / 3.5 ± 0.5 s, 1 time (Soldering should be at a distance of at least 1.5 mm from the body of the product.)

Marking Diagram

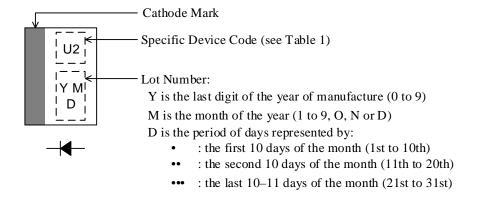
